Mary Murray, originally from Stirlingshire Scotland, has been dancing in Vancouver since the 1960's. She has taught all levels of classes for the Vancouver Branch, including many years as Director of the Vancouver Branch Demonstration Team. Mary teaches at the Branch, and conducts the Vancouver Branch Teacher Training Program. She is an official Examiner for the RSCDS and travels internationally in her capacity as an examiner and teacher.

Simon Scott has been dancing in Vancouver since 1962. As well as teaching for the Vancouver Branch and the Gleneagles Club, and directing the Vancouver Branch Demonstration Team, Simon has taught at many workshops internationally and at TAC Summer Schools. Simon has also distinguished himself as a deviser of Scottish Country Dances. He is currently a Director of the Vancouver Branch, Chairman of the Gleneagles SCD Club and its Director of Dance.

Julie Smith (class musician on piano), has been playing Scottish country dance music for over eight years and regularly plays for classes at Fort Langley. She has played for several workshops in the Vancouver area as well as other parts of B.C. She also plays piano with the Tartan Players.

Deborah Jones (class musician on fiddle), has been playing with the Vancouver Fiddle Orchestra since the early 1990's. In addition to playing Scottish country dance music with the VFO and the Tartan Players, Deborah plays with the traditional Scandinavian dance band "Gammel Dansk".

Cathrine Conings (class musician on piano), joined the Vancouver Fiddle Orchestra in 1995 and started playing for classes about five years ago. She also plays with Calanais for the Vancouver Ceilidhs.

The Tartan Players are a local band that has been playing for Scottish Country Dancing for several years, in Vancouver and other areas on the west coast. Many of the players are also dancers and they bring a lively energetic spirit to our dancing.
